-Does this person strive to draw the attention towards God or themselves?


### 6. Submissive

### 3. It's ultimately your choice



## BOOK REPORT #1

Wow. Where do I start? Going through this book has been both amazing and convicting. When I started "I Kissed Dating Goodbye," I had a slight idea of what Christian dating was, but after reading this book I know exactly what it is. Not only did this book teach me guidelines and expectations when in a Christian dating relationship, it taught me how to spend and



cherish the single years God gifts me with. Also, when I started to learn about dating, I didn't know there was a Christian approach to it. I had always also thought that courting was basically arranged marriage until reading this book. I have learned so much from this book and it has transformed my relationship views completely.

if you think you have found a person with all the qualities and expectations you have set up for yourself, but you are not ready to date, then it isn't meant to be. Joshua Harris has taught me a few things through this book and I think his guidelines can help you determine whether or not it is "meant to be." The right thing at the wrong time is the wrong thing. First off, are you ready to get married? If you are not ready to prepare for marriage, you should not be out looking for a husband/wife. Dating is not a hit and miss game like teens nowadays portray it. Singleness is a gift from God and if you date before you are ready, there are things that God will no longer be able to do in your life that he had planned. A good example is being on the mission field. If you are a missionary in your single years there are a lot of things God can do in your life and others, but if you have a girlfriend or wife and family, being away is going to be a lot harder.

Another very important aspect is purity. If you are dating someone before you are ready or should be dating you are putting your purity at risk and theirs. Even though you may start out as friends, it can lead to more very quickly. Most likely you won't marry the person your dating in high school or even middle school. Why risk your physical and emotional purity for someone you're not going to be with forever? You are not protecting each other's hearts as friends if you don't wait until you are ready to date. Now you are probably wondering what you are supposed to do. My advice to you is stay friends. Friendship with someone of the opposite sex can be a rewarding thing. You don't have the relationship block in your way and you can enjoy life being single, but still have the support of a great friend who can prepare you for life in the future you will share with someone else of

the opposite sex. I am definitely not implying to have no same sex friends, but pick those friends wisely. And if that person who has all the qualities you want but you aren't ready to date and he wants you to date, he isn't the right one. If you are too young to date you are also too young to know what you truly want in a husband/wife. Don't date now, because the qualities you want in a husband or wife could change before you're married. It isn't fair to let someone get emotionally attached to you know if you don't even know who you really are. Don't expect to find someone when you're young if you don't even know who you are as a person yet. Overall this book has been an amazing and I couldn't be happier with the impact it has left on me. ## BOOK REPORT #2

In the book, "I Kissed Dating Goodbye," by Joshua Harris, he discusses a better way of dating/courting. He shares his story about giving up dating and discovering that God has something even better- a life of sincere love, true purity, and purposeful singleness. He is not telling you to refrain from being single, he just shows a better way of dating, and it's called courting. Courting is basically getting to know someone you are attracted to, but only as a friendship. Why? Because dating is pretty much, "trying people out". With courting, you have made a promise to the other person, and letting them know you are looking to marry them as opposed to dating, where there is no real commitment to either person in the relationship. When courting someone you basically remain friends (and ONLY friends) with them, but get to know them better- not alone together but hanging out with each other in groups of friends or

family, which allows you to have a friendship with the person you are attracted to so that your feelings won't take you somewhere too far, and no hearts will end up broken if there's no real commitment. This is, at least, what I would do if I found someone who has the qualities I want and I wasn't yet ready for dating.

There were many things in this book that hit me like a brick wall. I'm going to write about just a few of the things that stuck out to me the most. The first thing that stuck out to me was his poem, "Dream," which is about a dream that Joshua has where he was in a room with drawers of index-card files with all of his sins and good deeds he had done in life, all lined up in alphabetical order. He got angry at himself when flipping through the large amount of cards with the sins he committed and the small quantity of things he'd done for God. But then, Jesus came and put His arm around him but didn't say a word and on the note cards and in place, was His name. This showed me that no matter what, Jesus will always forgive me (and anyone) no matter what we've done and He will never stop loving us. Another thing that stuck out to me was a couple of things he quoted on the book. Such as, "The sooner we get acquainted with the contents of our hearts, the better. Too many of us are blissfully unaware of how deceitful the core of our beings truly are. When we think 'heart' we picture cutesy, red, cutout valentines. But often, if we really examine our hearts, we'd find lies, selfishness, lust, envy and pride." Another quote- "Marriage won't transform us into new people, it will only act as a mirror, showing what we already are. We have to practice now what we want to be in the future." And yet another, "We prepare and develop our characters so we can become as flexible and useful for Him as possible, no

matter what He plans for our future." These quotes remind me that our hearts are not as pure and clean as we think, and we need to let God change us inside and out so that we will be transformed. And also, we will be able to work on being who God and our future spouses will want us to be. The final thing that stuck out to me that I'm going to mention is the fact that one of the ways for us to know if we're ready for marriage, would be looking at ourselves and asking, "do I have all the qualities I'm looking for in my husband so that I will be a good spouse?" We have to remember that we have to be mature enough to make sure we're a good spouse for someone before we go looking for someone else with these qualities. Even though Joshua Harris' title seems strange, what it appears to mean is not the true meaning. This book made me and (I think) my friends realize many things about healthy relationships and how dating and courting are completely different, and how courting is a better way to get into marriage. It taught me many things and reminded me that to enjoy my single years while I have them, to make sure I'm mature enough and changed enough to court someone, and to make sure that marriage is God's will for my life before I get myself into it.

## BOOK REPORT #3

I thought the book was great, one of the biggest things I got out of it was the importance of friendships. About finding the balance between casual friendship with girls and putting too much into a friendship that could cause intimacy before I was ready for commitment. I pretty much agreed with everything in the book and even though I haven't glorified God in my past relationships I plan on doing so from now on. I also got a lot about how my relationships with people reflect my relationship with God,

and that I have the opportunity to show Christ's love to every person I come in contact with.

As far as what to do if I think I've met the person before I'm ready for marriage, patience. I think it is a big time of relying on God for patience to wait and see whether or not God says she's the right person. Waiting till a time when I'm able to support myself with a job and place to live and then seeing if I still have feelings for her and it's possible to build a relationship past friendship. I think being friends is also important but super hard when you have feelings for the person. Finding the balance between not putting too much into the relationship and not putting anything at all is necessary so that while your waiting to be ready for commitment you'll still be able to grow in friendship looking towards God towards God.

It really sucks though because while I think patience is the most important thing it's also the hardest. I've learned a lot about how I can't trust my feelings completely and shouldn't let them affect me but I think I underestimate how persuasive they are. Thinking it's the right person gives way to crazy strong emotions that are so hard to ignore when it's influencing everything you do, especially when you're aware that while waiting God might show you she's not the right person for you. But like I said that's why we need to rely on God for strength to be patient for the right person regardless of who we were hoping it might be at the time.

So overall I liked the book a lot and feel like it really helped me in learning about finding the right person and different stages that are healthy and beneficial to go through when seeking out someone to marry. It's complicated and I don't think it will ever turn out how I plan it but I know that God will be with me every step of the way and that's all I really need to get through it.
